

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

**Blažení sú tí, čo kráčajú podľa zákona Pánovho.
Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!**

Niekedy si kresťania predstavujú Nebo ako niečo na spôsob Mohamedánskeho raja, akúsi blaženú neviazanosť, slobodu bez zákona, možnosť robiť, čo sa nám chce. V zásade to nie je zlá túžba: môcť robiť, čo sa nám chce. Problém je ale v tom, že po prvotnom hriechu sa všetko človeka naklonila ku zlu a teda často chceme to, čo nám v konečnom dôsledku škodi a k tomu, čo nám osozi sa musíme donútiť. Aj nás rozum je zatenený a naše videnie nie je spravne. Sv. Augustín to vyjadril veľmi trefne: „Božie Slovo (a teda aj Boží Zákon) sa ti bude najprv javiť ako nepriateľ tvojej duše, kým nepochopíš, že je príčinou tvojej Spásy.“

Boží zákon je cestou Spásy. Bol daný prvým ľuďom ako „návod na použitie“. Ked' kniha Genesíz opisuje pád prarodičov, spomína menovite dva stromy: Strom poznania Dobrą a Zla a Strom Života. Strom Života je Zjavené Božie Slovo, Boží zákon. Teda je to zo stromu poznania Dobra a Zla môže znamenat' pohrdnutie Božím Zákonom, snahu zobrať' si život do svojich vlastných rúk a žiť len podľa svojej vlastnej predstavy, čisté z vlastných sôl a pre seba. Niečo podobné, ako keby ste pri kúpe automatickej práčky povedali obchodníkovi, že nechcete návod na použitie. Určite by vám v takom prípade odmietol' dať aj list na záručnú lehotu. Človek je zložitý systém, ktorý sa skladá z duše i tela a samotné telo sa skladá z biliónov buniek. A tento celok môže správne fungovať len pri dodržiavaní určitých zákonov. Inak sa pokazí a zahynie, prestane ako človek správne fungovať. Človek ostáva človekom, kým zachováva Boží zákon.

Tento istý zákon bol daný Izraelu ako návod na cestu k plnej slobode z Egyptského otroctva. Exodus (Ex 20,1-17) nám kladie pred oči Desatora, Dekalog, ako

najdôležitejší extrakt s Božieho Zákona. Slovo „Dekalog“ môžeme preložiť ako „desať slov“. Týchto „desať slov“ Boh zjavil svojmu národu na svätom vrchu. Napísal ich „svojím vlastným prstom“ na rozdiel od iných príkazov, ktoré napísal Mojžiš. Desatora nebolo mienené ako strašiac na udržanie morálky. Pre Izrael znamenalo záväzny text zmluvy medzi Bohom a jeho vyvoleným ľudom, ktorý vyviedol z otroctva v Egypte. K lepšiemu pochopeniu Desatora je potrebné vidieť celú textovú súvislosť. Božie príkazy nie sú len tak ľubovoľne dane. Nie sú dané preto, aby sa ukázalo, či bude Izrael poslušný alebo nie. Nie sú to príkazy, ktorími nás chce Boh vyskúsať, a ktoré ráz v blaženej večnosti nebudeme dodržiavať. Desatora je zákon spolužitia s Bohom. Len človek, ktorý ho zachováva, sa môže tešiť z Božej blízkosti. Človek ostáva človekom, ked' zachováva Desatora. Jeho príkazy sa dotykajú aj medzi ľudských vzťahov. Majú zaistiť, aby tu vôbec zostal „ľudský priestor“, v ktorom by sa mohlo Božie prísľubenie realizovať.

We notice a potentially fruitful tension between the Gospel and the first reading from Sirach. While Jesus makes the commandments even more demanding, Sirach claims that we can keep the commandments if only we really want to. Both readings are very direct and there's no missing the message. One approach to today's Scriptures would be to take them as pointers and ideals for Christian morality. Jesus forbids not merely murder, as the most extreme form of disregard for another person, but also lesser forms of injuring others. What unites the three faults he lists (losing one's temper, using insulting names and of refusing to

forgive) is that in each case another person's feelings are trampled underfoot. The importance of forgiveness is shown by the fact that it comes before strictly religious duties, and presumably the same priority is assigned to the other two matters. So the point Jesus makes is that one must respect not simply people's right to life but also their right to dignity and self-respect.

Then he speaks about sexual purity, but broadening it out to purity of intention in general. A mere legal observance is utterly insufficient for Jesus. The words about self mutilation have never been understood literally by the Church and are best understood as a parable to express vividly the disastrous effects of sin. The correction he makes of the Old Law disallows an abuse which Moses tolerated, namely remarriage after divorce. The exceptive clause ("except on the ground of unchastity") has long been debated, but its main interpretation in the Catholic Church is that it refers to a previous marriage that was prohibited by Jewish laws. The only divorce permitted is one where

there was no real marriage, and Jesus was simply reaffirming the sanctity of the marriage bond, as in Genesis "the two shall become one flesh" — a loving, interdependent unity.

The prohibition of oaths has not been taken as literally by the Catholic Church as it has by some other Christians. Jesus held that oaths should not be necessary at all, if there is a general atmosphere of trust and truth-telling. In such a society reinforcement by oaths would not be needed. This it is an atmosphere of openness and mutual confidence which Jesus promoted. What he teaches by his corrections of the Law is a morality of values held from the heart.
